Protect yourself and your neighbours from fire

Stop the fire

- Always put your belongings inside the apartment or in the storage room.
- The stairwell and the external corridors should be free of, for example, newspapers, cardboard boxes and strollers.
- If a fire breaks out, it spreads quickly, forming toxic smoke.
- Locked doors to basements and attic spaces also reduce the risk of arson attacks.

Do not block the stairwell or external corridors

- The stairwell and external corridors should be cleared so that you can get out if there is a fire in the apartment.
- Ambulance and emergency services also need to be able to easily arrive to help in case of illness or fire.

If there is a fire, do this

Contain the fire!

If there is a fire in your apartment:

- Get out and close the door to the apartment behind you.
- The door prevents the fire and toxic smoke from spreading.
- Call 112 and inform them of the fire.

Stay in the apartment

If there is a fire in someone else's apartment and there is smoke in the stairwell or in external corridors:

- Stay in your apartment.
- Call 112 and inform them of the fire.
- Wait in the apartment until the emergency services help you out.
